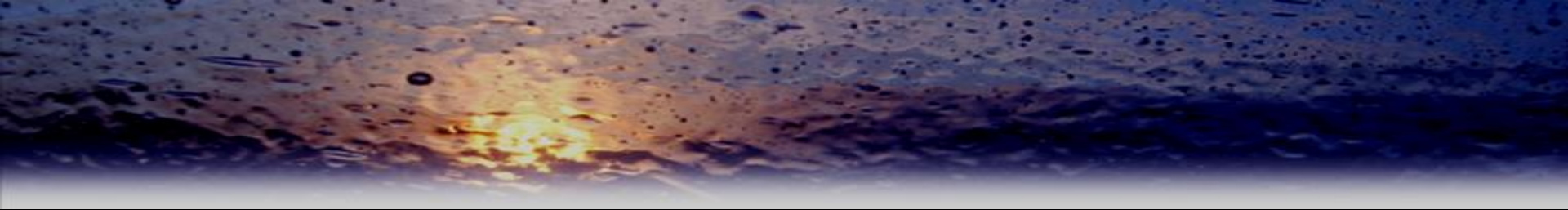
Psalm 23

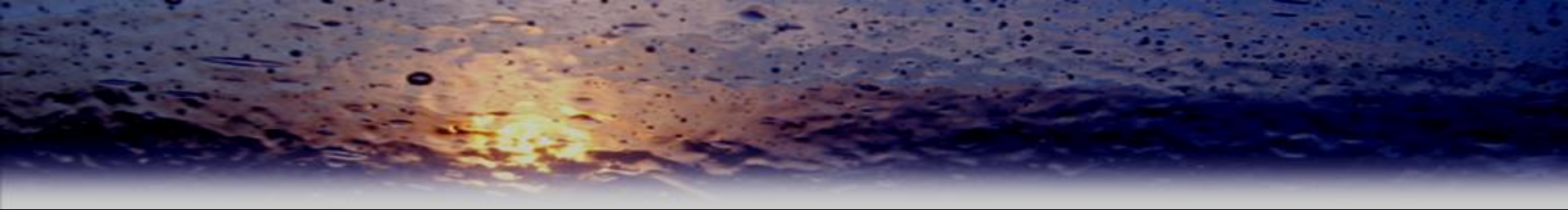

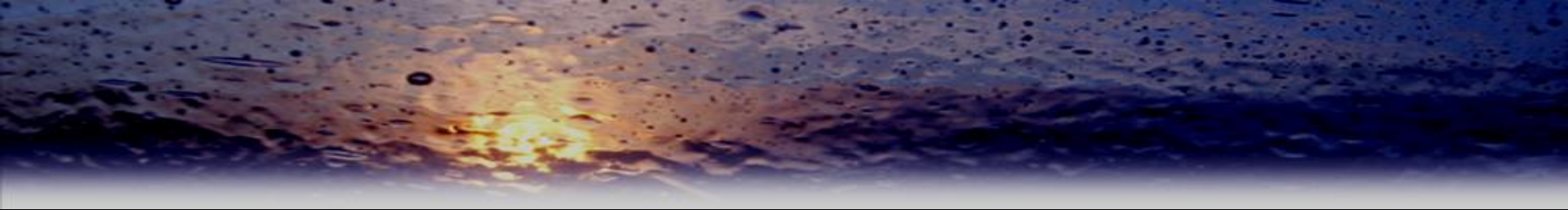


# Second Reading

Revelation 22:1-5

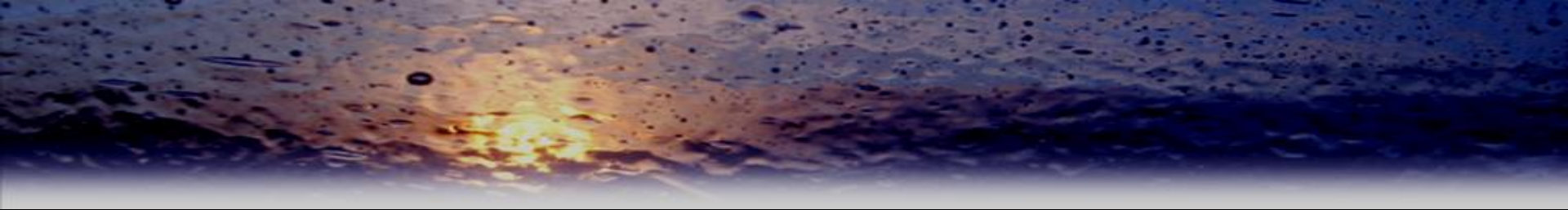
